Dear Eta Zeta Chapter:



Saying "Goodbye" to a Golden Rose

We are very sad to share the news of the passing of Cynthia DeVies, an Eta Zeta

Chapter member and Golden Rose Award honoree. Cynthia fell ill with an upper respiratory ailment that became severe in a short amount of time. Complications rendered her unable to recover and she passed away on Tuesday, December 20, 2022. Cynthia was born on March 17, 1938, making her a youthful eighty-four years old.

Cynthia was a friend, sister, mentor, and encourager. Many of you would recognize her as the lovely lady who shared her talents as a pianist at convention. As members would enter the ballroom for a meeting, luncheon, or dinner, melodies from Broadway musicals would serve as a welcome to the event. It was her hope that your heart would be lightened and encouraged by the songs she played. The music was her way of enhancing our Delta Kappa Gamma meetings for the better.

Cynthia DeVies joined Delta Kappa Gamma Eta Zeta Chapter in 1979. She transferred to Eta Eta Chapter for several years and had just returned to Eta Zeta Chapter in 2022.

Cynthia served as Eta Zeta Chapter President in 1990-1992 and then once again in 2004-2006. She was given the Chapter Achievement Award in 1995 and served on many committees at the chapter level throughout her years in Eta Zeta. Cynthia regularly attended the Coordinating Council luncheons throughout the years, providing musical accompaniment for the occasion to usher in chapter presidents and to provide the notes for our Delta Kappa Gamma Song. At the state level, Cynthia served on the Headquarters, Archives, Music, and Necrology Committees. She attended the Alpha State Leadership Seminar in 2007 and was awarded the Golden Rose Award in 2013. Her presence was felt at the state conventions in Austin, Beaumont, Lubbock, Amarillo, Irving, Frisco, McAllen, Dallas, Waco and The Woodlands, She also attended Regional conventions in Oklahoma

City, Branson, Reno, and Wichita, Kansas. She also attended the international conventions held in Austin, New York, and Nashville. Cynthia expressed her excitement and pride when asked to provide musical accompaniment at the regional and international conventions.

Cynthia's educational career began when she taught first grade for a year. When she retired she had served as a Choral Music Educator for forty-five years. She did choral directing for Dallas ISD, the Dallas Girl's Chorus and children's church choirs. Cynthia enjoyed judging the Dallas Summer Musical's High School Musical Award Program for eight years.

Cynthia loved the theatre. Local and Broadway musicals brought a smile to her face. In the community, Cynthia served on the DSM Guild Board of Directors as the Chair of weekly food solicitation for the casts of the musicals. Cynthia and her husband, Ron Devies, ushered at Theater Three and the Uptown Players for ten years.

For many years Cynthia has been a maker of melodies in Delta Kappa Gamma. It is my hope that when a Broadway tune is heard Cynthia DeVies, our Golden Rose, will come to mind.

Did You Know?

Schools for Africa has

been the first official international project of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International since 2010. Approximately \$445,134.90 has been donated in partnership with UNICEF. Through the years, Eta Zeta Chapter has played a part by collecting donations for the Schools for Africa Project. It is a partnership with UNICEF USA.

UNICEF stands for the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund. It was founded in 1946 by the United Nations to serve the children of the world's emergency needs in post-World War II Europe and China. The mandate was broadened in 1950 to address the long-term needs of children and women in developing countries.

The Schools for Africa Project currently works with 21 countries in the sub-Saharan Africa including the countries of Botswana, Burundi, Chad, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Madagascar, Mauritania, Mozambique, Nambia, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, and Uganda. The mission is to provide access to quality basic education for children with a focus on girls, orphans and other vulnerable youngsters.

Williams presented four new members for induction into the Eta Zeta Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International: Elaine Hudson, LaToya Maxey, Lauren Timms, and Melba Timms. All four were recommended for membership by Evelyn Hamilton.

President Marian Willard and members Mary Bixler and Mary Claire Welch each addressed the inductees to convey that they had been sponsored for membership because they were valued and appreciated as educators.

DKG Texas State President Shalan Inmon also participated in addressing the inductees. She gave a brief history of how Delta Kappa Gamma began in 1929 during the early days of the Depression. President Inmon pointed out that DKG currently has grown to have chapters in 17 countries throughout the world. Japan is the most recent country to join in participation in DKG. Many things are quite different for women educators today, but the seven purposes set forth by DKG nearly 100 years ago remain the same. The new members were encouraged to think about the mission and vision and program of work projects which make a difference in communities.

Eta Zeta Chapter President Marian Willard and Maria Viera-Williams conducted the formal induction ceremony which included lighting of candles representing *Loyalty, Cooperation, and the Ideals of the Society*. The candles serve as a reminder for educators to enlighten the darkness of ignorance and to spread knowledge and understanding. The inductees each entered their signature in the Inductees' Register and received a rose and pin. Marian Willard and Betty Ackerman were invited to join the new inductees in lighting candles and receiving pins since they had not previously had that opportunity due to meetings during the Pandemic being on Zoom.

Meeting Called to Order: President Marian Willard called the Eta Zeta Chapter Meeting to order at 6:59 p.m.

Meditation: Mary Claire Welch shared the reading of a poem titled, *The True Leadership Treasure*.

Welcome: Marian Willard extended a welcome to all present and a special welcome to DKG Texas State President Shalan Inmon.

Special Greetings from the State President: President Shalan Inmon offered specific and in-depth words of encouragement to the Eta Zeta members. She also recommended using <u>www.dkgtexas.org</u> as a resource.

Quorum Check and Approval of Agenda: A quorum was recognized to be present to conduct business. Both the Mission and Vision statements of DKG were printed on the agenda. Mary Bixler moved to approve the agenda as printed with the addition of the birthdays to be recognized and Mary Claire seconded the motion. A vote was taken to approve the agenda.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the October 17th Eta Zeta meeting had been electronically transmitted for review of the members prior to the meeting. Betty Ackerman also provided copies to be distributed at the meeting. Maria Viera-Williams moved to approve the minutes, and Mary Claire Welch seconded the motion. A vote was taken to approve the minutes as recorded.

Correspondence: Mary Claire Welch emphasized that details of dates and locations pertaining to conventions and conferences will be included in the chapter newsletter which is sent electronically. She also encouraged members with 'a yearning to write' to contribute to the Eta Zeta Press.

Mary Claire made membership aware of the CCDC (Coordinating Council of Dallas County) luncheon/ speaker event scheduled for morning of April 22 at Lakewood County Club. Members with 25 and 50 years will be recognized and honored. An invitation from the CCDC will be sent to members and they will need to make a reservation by paying the cost of the luncheon to Treasurer, Leigh Taylor. The Telephone Committee comprised of Liz Taheri, Mary Bixler, and Jeannie Morrison will make calls to members with information as the time for the event is closer at hand.

President's Report: President Marian Willard echoed the comments made by State President Inmon regarding grants and scholarships offered by Eta Zeta. She also added her encouragement for members to plan to attend the state conference as well as the international conference in Detroit, MI. She noted that more detailed information will appear in the newsletter.

Marian Willard brought before the body that Eta Zeta is responsible for the music for the CCDC luncheon event, and the chapter will need to submit payment of \$40 to CCDC for dues. Evelyn Hamilton moved to submit the payment to CCDC, and Maria Viera-Williams seconded the motion. A vote to make the payment passed.

First Vice-President's Report: In Natalie Perez Brown's absence, Mary Bixler provided information about the program planned for the January meeting to be held at James Madison High School. There is an ongoing effort at James Madison to help students to develop financial literacy. A report on how the program is operating will be presented for Eta Zeta at the January meeting.

Natalie will communicate to membership any possible project in December since there is no meeting scheduled.

Mary Bixler reminded members that the Rainbow Room is a non-profit organization that provides for a collection of items to be available to social workers who have removed children from abusive living situations. Members of Eta Zeta may always donate either items or money for support of the Rainbow Room. Especially needed items were posted in the newsletter and may be brought to the January meeting. Those items to the meeting will be transported to the Rainbow Room at the office of Community Partners of Dallas for donation.

Second Vice-Presidents' Membership Report: Maria Viera-Williams welcomed each of the four new members.

Treasurer's Report: Leigh Taylor gave the treasurer's report and there was no activity in the bank account except for the \$6 service fee.

Unfinished Business: President Marian Willard presented the four inductees with tokens of appreciation for choosing Eta Zeta. State President Shalan Inmon was also presented a gift as a token of appreciation for sharing her time to visit our chapter.

Birthdays & Anniversaries: Birthdays and Anniversaries/Celebrations for November and December were acknowledged and celebrated.

Songs: The membership present joined to sing in harmony The Birthday/Anniversary Song and The Delta Kappa Gamma Song.

Meeting Adjourned: President Marian Willard adjourned the Eta Zeta Chapter meeting at 7:45 p.m.
